Henry Huber, Savage School AD, recommended changes to the Coaches Handbook regarding practice schedule and times for the different school divisions. The Savage School Board of Trustees approved the following changes on December 19, 2016:

### **Practice schedules and times**

A Practice Schedules and Times: Varsity and J.V. combined practice shall be a MAXIMUM of three hours. If practicing separately, the Varsity portion will not exceed 2.25 hours and J.V. portion to be a minimum of 1.5 hours.

B. Practice blocks for High School boys and girls early and late will be rotated weekly, (unless mutually agreed upon by the coaches and Title IX guidelines).

C. Practice blocks for Elementary will be 1 hour.

D. Practice on days with interference from other activities requiring the use of the gym will be scheduled as evenly as possible for boys and girls.

E. Morning practices will be allowed and on a rotation that follows B guidelines.
