Superintendent's News

Dear Savage,

We are entering the season of family gatherings of giving thanks and sharing goodwill within our small community that extends to relatives that live far from us and friends that we may rarely see. You may take special effort to reach out to those that are in our hearts and minds because of the special memories you share and the hope that more will be created in the future. And we do have so much for which to give thanks. Savage is an area that is not so commonly found in the US anymore. Everyone knows each other's families, homes, dogs, and even when a neighbor's tail light is out. Better yet, we watch out for those that we know are experiencing challenges in their daily lives, and reach out to see how we can help those overcome obstacles or just to let them know we are thinking of them.

With the development of the Bakken Oilfield, our community is getting larger and more diverse, which means sharing of different cultures and adjusting to the pains that accompany such rapid growth. The most pressing concern of the school is that we are starting to face situations that are more likely to happen in larger, more urban areas. 
