Dear Savage,

October ushers in the second full month of school for our students and teachers, and our students are slowly adjusting to the demands of new classes and academic challenges. Much has been going on at the school and several things need to be celebrated. The chemistry class has new Kindle Fire devices and is piloting an online textbook. A few students have commented that everyone should have one. Ten new laptops have been purchased for the computer lab and are used for Montana Digital Academy. Two new smart boards have been purchased to ensure that all teachers have this technology available to them. Our new camera security system is up and running as of Friday, September 26th. Our recently installed doors to the office and playground entrances have brightened up the hallways. The elementary students continue to use the renovated playground as long as there is daylight. Our new Vo-Ag teacher, Jessie Ross, has taken the Wildlife Management class to the river to build and evaluate blinds. She has also purchased some chicks to raise and produce eggs. 


