Stonehocker attends MSP Conference

Toward the end of June, 25 teachers from across Montana and I plus eight mentor teachers and 5 university professors began a journey in a program called MSP LEAD. The acronym stands for "A Mathematics and Science Partnership for Teacher Leadership. The program so far has consisted of three modules, or classes, and then in August we met at the Montana Learning Center (MLC) at Canyon Ferry Lake near Helena.

The first of the three modules revolved around a survey that assessed your individual leadership style. The survey results consisted of four main

styles; Dominance, Influence, Conscientiousness and Steadiness. Would it be a surprise if I told you mine is a combination of conscientious and steady? The second module took us through the different leadership characteristics and roles. As teachers, we have our different characteristics which if blended properly can make us a strong team. We also play different roles as teachers, especially in a small community like Savage. When we better understand how to fulfill those roles we help ourselves and our students to progress and accomplish the development of educated citizens. The third module taught us to look for our why. When

we know why we want to accomplish a goal, the what and how begin to show up and we'll more easily accomplish goals. During the Leadership Academy at MLC, we learned more of the concepts of leadership and developed a personal Leadership Plan (PLP). Over the next few months I will be implementing that plan.

I am grateful for the opportunity to go through this program. I went in not totally sure what I was in for, thinking it was something along the line of helping me teach mathematics more effectively. Instead, I have learned a lot about leadership and will strive to become a teacher leader.
