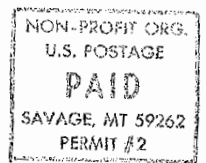

Dear Savage,

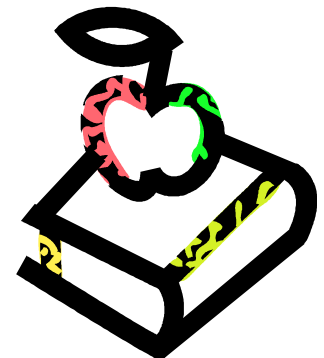

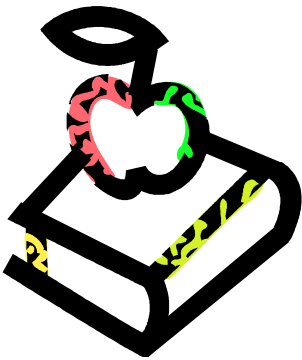
### DID YOU KNOW???????
